Certificate of Inspection Sheet Guide

Definitions:

- "Low-speed vehicle" means a three- or four-wheeled motor vehicle with an attainable speed in one mile
 on a paved level surface of more than twenty miles per hour but not more than twenty-five miles per hour
 and with a gross vehicle weight rating less than three thousand pounds.
- "Under-speed vehicle" means a three- or four-wheeled vehicle, including a vehicle commonly known as a golf cart, with an attainable speed on a paved level surface of not more than twenty miles per hour and with a gross vehicle weight rating less than three thousand pounds.
- "Utility vehicle" means a self-propelled vehicle designed with a bed, principally for the purpose of transporting material or cargo in connection with construction, agricultural, forestry, grounds maintenance, lawn and garden, materials handling, or similar activities.
- "Mini-truck" means a vehicle that has four wheels, is propelled by an electric motor with a rated power of seven thousand five hundred watts or less or an internal combustion engine with a piston displacement capacity of six hundred sixty cubic centimeters or less, has a total dry weight of nine hundred to two thousand two hundred pounds, contains an enclosed cabin and a seat for the vehicle operator, resembles a pickup truck or van with a cargo area or bed located at the rear of the vehicle, and was not originally manufactured to meet federal motor vehicle safety standards.

Steps of Application Process:

- 1. The sheriff or chief of police in the community (city, village, township) provides the applicant a certificate of inspection regarding the inspection requirements of the Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.) Chapter 4501-30-02 Equipment to be inspected;
- 2. The original copy of the inspection sheet will be provided to the vehicle owner who can then go to the Clerk of Courts title office in any county. The clerk will verify that the inspection certificate accompanies the title evidence and the vehicle inspection requirements. If verified and everything else is in order, the clerk will issue the title; and
- 3. The vehicle owner will take the title to a deputy registrar in Athens County. If all is in order, the deputy registrar will issue license plates.

Re-Inspection

If the vehicle fails to meet all the requirements, the vehicle may be re-inspected at a later date. The re-inspection process would be conducted following the same guidelines.
